"Non-destructive and Semi-destructive Testing Methods for Concrete and Masonry Structures"

There are many methods used to evaluate concrete and masonry during or after construction. These testing methods may be used to detect damage to, or voids in, concrete, corrosion activity in embedded reinforcement, delimitation of materials, and *in situ* properties. This presentation explains the method and use of many of these techniques.

Todd Allen is President of Radarview/Universal Construction Testing (UCT) headquartered in Houston, TX with locations throughout Texas plus Chicago and Miami. His background

includes 20 years as an NDT applications engineer. His education includes a Degree in Marine Technology from the National University Polytechnic Institute in Los Angeles, CA. September SEAoT Dallas Meeting Recap

"Advanced Topics in Post-Tensioning" was presented by Miroslav Vejvoda, P.E., of the Post-Tensioning Institute. presentation covered the use of encapsulated PT, including new requirements for grouting tendons used in ACI 318 applications, certification of inspectors and installers, timely tensioning, cutting and finishing of tendons, and the use of PT in two-way slabs, integrity requirements. There was also discussion of PT shear walls, transfer girders, and the detailing of ends anchorages and openings. Finally, external PT was addressed as a means to resolve structural deficiency in existing members.
