"Fragility and Retrofit Decision Analysis for GLD RC Frame Structures"

January 28, 2014

#### **Presentation Overview:**

Gravity Load Designed (GLD) Reinforced Concrete (RC) Frame Structures exist in regions where seismic risks are minor to moderate in old and, in many cases, new construction. They also exist in regions of high seismic risk in older infrastructure. Past work done at SUNY at Buffalo indicates that such structures have inherent lateral resistance, but are prone to non-desirable soft-story column mechanisms under moderate to severe seismic excitations. In this presentation, the seismic fragility of these buildings will be summarized based on simulated ground motions for the Mid-America region, where the fragility is defined as the conditional probability of exceeding a given limit state (or capacity) for a specified seismic demand, in this case the fundamental spectral acceleration of the ground motion. The second part of the presentation summarizes the decision analysis framework for the retrofit of such construction in a given seismic region. Comparisons of the reliability index for such existing and retrofitted GLD RC frame construction in San Memphis and San Francisco are then presented.



Joseph M. Bracci is the A.P. and Florence Wiley Professor II in the Zachry Department of Civil Engineering at Texas A&M University and a registered Professional Engineer in the State of Texas. He received his B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in Civil Engineering from the State University of New York at Buffalo in 1987, 1989, and 1992, respectively. During his PhD, he was employed as a lecturer to teach various undergraduate classes, as well to perform research. In 1993, he worked as a structural engineer at EQE International in San Francisco on the seismic soil-structure interaction response of nuclear facilities. Since September of 1993, he has worked at Texas A&M University starting as an Assistant Professor, received

tenure in September of 1999, and promoted to Professor in September of 2005. His research experience has dealt with the behavior, adequacy, preservation, and sustainability of building and bridge infrastructure that are exposed to a variety of slow-forming degrading material mechanisms and also to rapid-forming hazardous environmental loading. He is a Fellow of the American Concrete Institute. He was the recipient of the Williams Brother Construction
